**Indian Creek Trail (Lydia to UP) - \$255,245.00 Mega Construction Bid Amount**

Project scope includes 10 wide hard surface trail and limestone retaining walls along the Indian Creek Greenway from Lydia Avenue east to the Union Pacific Railroad Right-of-Way. The project bid January 27, 2010 with Mega Construction submitting the low bid at \$255,245.00 and DBE participation of 6%. Pre-Construction meeting was held on April 14. Notice to Proceed will be issued for Thursday April 15, 2010. All work should be and construction and final completion by September 2010.

Mega construction has mobilized and completed tree clearing, stone retaining wall and rough grading is at 60%. Change order for some bank stabilization is in the process. The trail has been under water twice in the last two week and creek banks are showing signs of soil movement and may need to be stabilized.

**Background**

On May 11, 2009 Kansas City Park Recreation Department had been selected for Transportation Enhancement Program funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act to receive up to \$365,000.00 in Grant Funding. The Missouri Department of Transportation (MODOT) has assigned ARRA-ES04(024) as the federal project number.

ARRA funds will be used to construct pedestrian walking trail for approximately 2,300 linear feet along the Indian Creek Greenway under the authority of the Kansas City Parks and Recreation Department. The area is used as a pedestrian trail for walkers and bicyclist for access to neighborhoods, businesses, schools and recreational areas. This section of trail connects: Missouri to Kansas, Five cities, two counties, and several miles of trail.
