<b>Primary purpose/description of this program:</b> To provide grant funds for the abatement and cleanup of the Former Greyhound Bus Terminal property at 700 E. 12 <sup>th</sup> Street within the East Village redevelopment project.	
<b>Federal Funding through ARRA:</b> Requested \$200,000 in competition November 2008. EPA will allocate about \$48 million to the top ranked proposals submitted in November 2008.	
<b>Other funding sources / Local Match needed?:</b> About \$270,000 in Missouri Brownfield remediation tax credits / 20% local match required.	
<b>Administrative Costs and Eligibility for covering those costs:</b> Limited programmatic costs (administrative) eligible for funding (est. 3%); indirect organization costs not eligible for funding.	
<b>Funding Period:</b> July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2012	
<b>Services provided to the public:</b> Brownfield cleanup; creation of temporary construction and environmental jobs; potential creation of permanent jobs and/or affordable housing from site redevelopment; helps fulfill City’s East Village obligation to remove blighted structure	
<b>Essential services this program fulfills:</b> Elimination of blight; Elimination of dangerous building; Elimination of potential health hazard; Economic Development	
<b>Community Partners/coalitions/committees the Program/Project works with to achieve its mission and goals:</b> East Village LLC partner, Swope Community Builders; Paseo West Neighborhood Association; Downtown Neighborhood Association. <b>Expected Outcomes of Program / Project:</b> Blight removal, site cleanup, and site readiness for public/private investment and redevelopment.
