Primary purpose/description of this program: To provide decent, affordable housing and create economic opportunities primarily for persons of low- and moderate-income.	
Federal Funding through ARRA: The City will receive \$2,371,367 of which \$386,781 is proposed to be used for this project.	
Other funding sources / Local Match needed?: Additional renovation funding from Economic Development Administration	
Administrative Costs and Eligibility for covering those costs: Ten percent of the grant can be used to cover the city’s eligible administrative costs.	
Funding Period: Funding remains available until September 30, 2012.	
Services provided to the public: The building serves as a core location for emerging small businesses and will assist in the retainage and expansion of jobs in the 18 th & Vine area. The building also provides space for holding neighborhood meetings.
