The HPRP established in the March 16, 2009 Federal Register (FR 0097-1767), is to provide homeless prevention assistance to households who would otherwise become homeless in part due to the economic crisis; and to provide rapid re-housing to those persons who are homeless as defined by Section 103 of the McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11302). The Kansas City Hope Project expects to stabilize housing for approximately 1,755 families and individuals.

Goal 1 - Prevent People from Becoming Homeless. Prevention requires extensive community outreach to identify people at risk of becoming homeless. A standard/universal assessment and risk factor guidance will be used to identify persons in need who meet the "but for" test. The Plan calls for outreach, targeting, and effectiveness objectives.

A. Prevention Outreach - Non-traditional and traditional means of outreach will be used. We will utilize traditional and non-traditional means to reach potentially eligible persons. United Way's 2-1-1 data in the first six (6) months, shows a trend upward in the demand for emergency assistance services, i.e., 31,876 (2007), 36,955 (2008), and 48,083 (2009). Since data is based on zip code, we will examine reports to identify zip codes that have the most demand for eligible services.

The fund provides resources necessary housing stabilization. Our first quarter activities focused on preparing for project implementation. Specific activities included, but was not limited to, developing and initiating request for proposal/qualifications for procurement of housing and lead base paint (LBP) inspections, hiring project staff, completing the contracting process to encumber funding to subrecipient agencies awarded funding, obligating the funds in IDIS, and working with subrecipients and local Continuum of Cares to create standard implementation tools, i.e assessment tools, income and asset standards, housing location forms, financial assistance tracking form, etc.</p>

## Notes

### Potential Question

Not all of my text is showing up when I enter values a narrative field. For example, when entering text for the Project Description field.

When I try to select a value from a drop-down menu, the text is too small to read. How to I make it bigger?

I don't know which CFDA to use.

I'm not sure what each of the data elements mean.

I have more than 400 Sub Recipients or Vendors to add, but the spreadsheet looks like it is limited to 400.

**Answer**

This is a limitation of Excel. Although each cell holds up to 32,767 characters, Excel only displays 1,024 characters in the cell itself. To view all of the text you've entered for a given field, click on the cell in question and the text will display in the formula bar at the top of the screen.

Check to make sure you're viewing the workbook at 100% zoom. If your zoom is set to less than 100%, this can cause the text in the drop-down menus to appear very small.
