 - The board member capacity and term and that each member represent a region of the city.
 - To whom the application is to be sent to after completion.
- **The application requests the following information from each applicant...**
 - **Name, address, phone, neighborhood, employer, and email address.**
 - **Questions such as:**
 - **How did you hear about KCNAC?**
 - **What qualities/skills/abilities do you bring to KCNAC?**
 - **Are you willing to participate in related training?**
 - **List all boards, committees, elected positions, professional organizations, and community activities on which you have served or currently serve.**
 - **Ask to list anything from the applicant’s background that could be an embarrassment to the applicant or KCNAC?**
 - **List the name, address, phone, and email address of two personal references and their relationship to the applicant.**
 - **Notification of the time commitment to the KCNAC as a board member.**
- Those applicants who are not selected on the board will be considered for committees provided that these individuals have the qualifications that will benefit the board.

Application Checklist

- When reviewing applications, the board will use a checklist.

Follow-up letter

- **Include basic requirements such as...**
 - **Registered voter**
 - **No outstanding housing bench warrants ...**
