

Effective Dates and Applicability for newly adopted APWA Standards

APWA 5600

1. New stormwater management standards apply to development plans (i.e., preliminary plats, CUPs, etc.) submitted after October 9, 2006.
2. New stormwater management standards apply to approved development plans with submittal of the next plat, if no previous platting activity has occurred since October 9, 1996.
3. New stormwater management standards do not apply to new phases of development within an approved development plan, if they do not add area to the overall plan and platting activity has occurred since October 9, 1996.
4. New stormwater management standards apply to the modified portion of development plans that add area to the development plan after October 9, 2006.
5. New stormwater management standards will apply to development plans where significant changes are made after October 9, 2006. Significant changes are defined as:
 - A change in overall land use that would impact stormwater runoff volumes and rates.
 - An increase in the number of lots equal to or greater than 5% of the previously approved development plan.
 - An increase in the developed area of 5% or more of the previously approved development plan.
 - Any change to plans located in the floodplain or near sensitive water features as delineated by the stream assessment program.

APWA 5100

1. New erosion and sediment control standards, with the exception of Section 5102, will apply to development plans submitted after October 9, 2006.
2. New erosion and sediment control standards, with the exception of Section 5102, will apply to approved development plans by way of subsequent final plat applications submitted after October 9, 2006.
3. The requirements set forth in Section 5102 will be in place on or before October 9, 2007 (one year from the effective date of the resolution).

APWA 2100 and the BMP Manual are effective as of October 9, 2006.
